DNP Admission Criteria

- A BSN and/or MSN from an NLNAC, ACEN, CNEA, or CCNE accredited nursing program at a regionally accredited institution
- Current unencumbered Compact State Registered Nurse (RN) license
- Licensure as an unencumbered Registered Nurse in Pennsylvania (PA) or will acquire PA license
- An undergraduate grade point average of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale
- Applicants with a GPA below 3.0 may be admitted on a probationary basis.
 *Students admitted on probation will be considered for full admission after satisfactory completion of six credits of graduate coursework with a grade of B in
 - each course



DNP Admission Criteria

- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended.
- Statement of goals and potential scholarly project essay. The candidate is
 to write an essay on a topic to include professional goals related to the
 DNP and a health care issue that could possibly serve as the inspiration for
 a future DNP scholarly project.
- Professional résumé.
- Interview may be requested by the School of Nursing

DNP Program

- Two tracks: MSN-DNP Leadership and MSN/APRN-DNP Leadership
- Courses offered over 8 week Semesters
- Online asynchronous courses
- Part time and Full time options available for both program tracks



DNP Program Tracks

MSN-DNP Leadership

35 credits/1000 clinical hours to complete the degree

This track is designed for nurses seeking a terminal degree in nursing practice and offers an alternative to research-focused doctoral programs.



DNP Program tracks

MSN/APRN-DNP Leadership

26 credits/500 clinical hours and 500 transfer clinical hours to complete the degree

This track is designed for Nurse Practitioners seeking the highest leadership role with increased earning potential.
